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2023 HBCU PHILANTHROPY SYMPOSIUM







Delaware State University (DSU) hosted the 13th Annual HBCU Philanthropy Symposium July 30 through August 2, 2023, at the Gaylord Resort and Convention Center in National Harbor, Maryland, attracting its largest group of attendees and sponsors since the conference began in 2012. More than 500 participants convened for this invaluable forum aimed at advancing sustainability and transformation within the Historically Black College and University (HBCU)/minority serving institution (MSI) arena through a fundraising lens. Attendees included presidents, deans, Institutional Advancement leaders and staff from 56 HBCUs and 6 MSIs, as well as corporate, foundation and governmental representatives.

Under the theme "Assessing Today: Planning for Tomorrow," the symposium opened with a powerful keynote presentation by Dr. Harry L. Williams, President and CEO of Thurgood Marshall College Fund (TMCF), followed by highlights of the nation's efforts to advance HBCUs from President Biden's Board of Advisors on HBCUs Chair and DSU President Tony Allen, PhD and White House Initiative on HBCUs Executive Director Dietra Trent, PhD. General sessions featured panel discussions and presentations on how to leverage private foundation and corporate support to strengthen student success and public confidence, the implications of the recent U.S. Supreme Court ruling on Affirmative Action in higher education and diversity in the workforce, HBCU president perspectives, specific initiatives powered by corporate and private entities to support HBCUs, and the imperative for HBCUs and fundraising. Breakout sessions provided opportunities for fundraising professionals to share and discuss best practices in fundraising, alumni engagement, governance, and corporate collaborations, among other topics.

This year's conference also featured two new initiatives. The Pete du Pont Freedom Foundation held an innovative solution competition during which attendees exchanged and pitched ideas focused on HBCU capacity building, sustainability, social justice initiatives, student engagement and retention, and alumni engagement. Attendees voted on the top ideas to move on to a series of workshops and consulting sessions to help those who generated the ideas to further build out their visions into strategic action plans over the next six months, with one winner ultimately receiving funding to help move their idea forward. The inaugural Dr. Alma S. Adams HBCU Leadership Award was also announced and presented to its namesake, U.S. Representative Alma S. Adams, in recognition of her legislative advocacy on behalf of HBCUs.
